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Welcome to Sentence Repair Lab

Sentence Repair Lab provides five ready-to-use lessons that help students recognize complete sentences, diagnose fragments and run-on sentences, choose suitable repairs, and apply these skills when editing paragraphs.

Each lesson is self-contained. Teachers and homeschool parents may use the complete sequence as a unit on fragments and run-on sentences or select individual lessons according to their students' needs.

QUICK START

1. Choose the lesson you want to teach.
2. Select the printable or digital student format.
3. Open the *Teacher Guide and Answer Key* for the suggested lesson sequence, presentation, digital worksheet links, and complete answers.

THE FIVE-LESSON SEQUENCE

Lesson 1: What Makes a Sentence Complete?

Apply three checks: subject, finite verb, and complete thought.

Lesson 2: Why Is This Sentence a Fragment?

Diagnose and repair missing-subject, missing-verb, dependent-clause, and phrase fragments.

Lesson 3: Run-On Sentences

Identify fused sentences and comma splices by locating the boundary between independent clauses.

Lesson 4: Choosing the Best Repair

Use periods, semicolons, coordinating conjunctions, and subordination to communicate relationships clearly.

Lesson 5: Editing Fragments and Run-On Sentences in Paragraphs

Apply the complete repair process to six longer paragraphs. This lesson may be completed during a lesson, assigned as independent practice, or divided across two sessions.

Suggested pacing: approximately 30 minutes per lesson.

The printable and digital versions contain the same exercises.

WHAT'S INCLUDED

Every Lesson Includes:

TEACHER GUIDE AND ANSWER KEY

The *Teacher Guide and Answer Key* provide classroom teachers and homeschool parents with a learning objective, suggested lesson sequence, teaching reminders, discussion guidance, and complete answers. Model responses and acceptable alternatives are included for open-ended repairs.

CLASSROOM PRESENTATION

Use the presentation to introduce or review the lesson concept. Lessons 1–4 contain a short instructional presentation. Lesson 5 contains a one-slide editing reference for use before the paragraph activity.

STUDENT PRINTABLE

The printable file contains the student reference, focused practice, application activity, and writing or editing task. Print only the pages required for the selected lesson.

DIGITAL STUDENT WORKSHEET

The Google Slides worksheet contains the same exercises as the printable version. Students type their answers into the prepared response areas.

DIGITAL FILE NOTE

Google Slides links are available in every teacher guide and on the central Digital Access page.

Use the prepared digital worksheet for online assignments or individual homeschool practice. Do not upload the printable PDF to Google Slides, since it does not contain prepared student response areas.

HOW TO USE THIS RESOURCE

1. Teach or review the skill.

Use the presentation to introduce and model the lesson concept with a class or an individual learner.

2. Choose a student format.

Choose either the student printable or the digital student worksheet. Both formats contain the same exercises.

3. Review student work.

Use the *Teacher Guide and Answer Key* to discuss responses, evaluate open-ended answers, and address any remaining difficulties.

ACCESSING GOOGLE SLIDES

Each Teacher Guide contains a Digital Access page with links to that lesson's:

- presentation
- digital student worksheet

Select *Make a Copy* beneath the resource you want to use. Google will ask you to confirm that you want to create a copy. The new file will then be saved in your Google Drive.

This central guide also contains a complete set of the digital links on [page 8](#). These are provided as a convenient backup in case you cannot locate a lesson's Teacher Guide or Digital Access page.

USING OR ASSIGNING A DIGITAL WORKSHEET

For Classroom Use

1. Open the digital worksheet copy saved in your Google Drive.
2. Rename the file if desired and keep one clean master copy.
3. Assign a separate copy to each student through Google Classroom or your preferred learning platform.
4. Ask students to complete the worksheet in Edit mode.
5. Student work will save automatically in Google Drive.

For Homeschool Use

1. Open the digital worksheet copy saved in your Google Drive.
2. Rename the file if desired and keep one clean master copy.
3. Create a separate working copy for your student.
4. Ask the student to complete the worksheet in Edit mode.
5. The completed work will save automatically in Google Drive.

Important: Do not give students editing access to your clean master copy. Each student should receive an individual copy.

DIGITAL USE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

Before Using or Assigning a Worksheet

- Keep one clean master copy in your Google Drive.
- Rename working copies if this helps you organize completed work.
- Create or assign one separate copy to each student.
- Ask students to work in Edit mode, not Slideshow mode.
- Test one student copy before giving the worksheet to your student or class.

Working in Google Slides

Students type their answers directly into the designated response boxes. Some fixed text and design elements cannot be edited. This helps preserve the worksheet layout.

Students may resize the view or use the zoom controls if they need a closer look at the page.

Common Problems

The link opens the “Make a copy” screen.

This is correct. Select Make a copy to save the resource in your Google Drive.

The file does not open.

Make sure you are signed in to a Google account and try the link again.

A student is changing the master copy.

Remove the student’s access and create or assign a separate working copy. Do not share the master file with editing permission.

A student cannot type an answer.

Confirm that the student is working in Edit mode and has selected the intended response box.

The formatting looks slightly different.

Use the resource in Google Slides whenever possible. Downloading or opening it in another program may alter spacing or fonts.
